Protecting our Planet



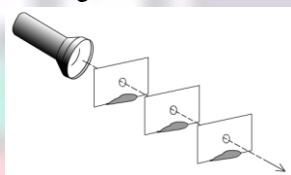
Class Little Germany

Throughout the day we will pause for reflection to consider our values through prayer.

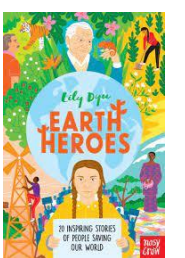

Learning at home: Children will also be given a list of spellings on a Friday, which can be accessed through Spelling Shed and they will be tested on the correct spellings the following Friday. Reading books need to be brought into school daily. When a child reads at home 5 times per week, they receive a raffle ticket. The tickets are then entered into the draw for the children to have the opportunity to take home our 'Snuggle up and read' bags.

P.E: Children will need to come into school in their P.E kit on **Mondays and Tuesdays.**

Writing : In our writing lessons this half term, we will be exploring the text *Earth Heroes*. We will be writing a persuasive speech about protecting our planet and a Non-Chronological report about endangered animals. The children will focus on using a range of punctuation to aid the readers and a using features to add additional detail to engage the reader.



Maths: In our maths lesson, we will be revisiting topics previously taught in preparation for the SATs. We will look at reasoning questions and multi-step problems using a range of methods to enable us to answer the questions.

Reading: In our reading lessons, we will explore a range of texts including texts about space tourism, sleep and The Saxons. We will continue to develop our retrieval and inference skills through the lessons.
