

### History

We will be learning about significant people and places within Manningham. We will make our own timelines tracking significant events within Manningham. We will be focusing on Samuel Lister and the wool industry along with thinking about how the Victorian times have influenced our lives today.

We will be using a range of sources to discover whether Samuel Lister was a fair businessman.



### Geography

We will use maps and atlases to locate Manningham. We will be thinking about the human features of Manningham, considering the amenities, housing, and land use. Thinking about the wool industry, we will learn about how Manningham influenced global trade.

## Our Bradford Manningham

For the first two weeks of term, we will be building on the pupils' local knowledge and learning about Manningham and Lister Park. During the topic, we will mainly focus on Geography and History.

To end our unit of learning we will be creating non-chronological reports about Manningham.

maps - a picture of a particular area of the earth or sky drawn or printed to scale on a flat surface

atlas/ atlases - a book of maps, tables, or charts

mills - a building with machinery

wool merchant - someone who buys and sells wool

back-to-back houses - two houses that share a back wall

terraced houses - houses built in a continuous row and that look the same

industrial revolution - using machines to change the way of producing products

park - a large public area of land used for recreation

landmark - a feature or object on a town that is easily seen and recognised from a distance

street - a public road in a town with houses on either side.
