History


In class we will learn about the impact of industrialisation on Bradford and research the history and importance of Salts Mill. The children will discover a typical day in the life of a mill worker. We will learn about the significance of Sir Titus Salt, his influence on Bradford and his "model village" at Saltaire. We will discuss whether his ideas made him a local hero or a disliked villain!

Geography

We will be exploring the location of Saltaire through Ordinance Survey (OS) maps and how the area has changed over time.

Our Bradford Saltaire

For the first two weeks of term, we will be building on the pupils' local knowledge and learning about Saltaire, Sir Titus Salt and his famous mill. During the topic, we will mainly focus on Geography and History.
