Secondary School Applications

The online system is now open for Year 7 applications. If your child lives in the Bradford District, you should apply through the online admissions system between 12 September 2022 and 31 October 2022. If your child is currently in Year 6, but was not born between 1 September 2011 and 31 August 2012, please contact the Admissions Team for a paper application form. If your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan (**EHCP**) please do not apply through the online system, you will be sent a separate letter and preference form by the SEN team.

If you require any assistance making an application for your child please contact the school office and Miss Moore will be happy to help.

Open Morning and Macmillan Fundraiser

All parents/carers are invited to join us on Friday 14th October for our Open Morning.

Attendance

I would like to start by saying a huge thank you to the 188 children who have attended every day so far this term. As a school we aim for a whole school attendance figure of 97%, our current whole school attendance is 96.8%. We understand there are times when you child may be ill and cannot attend and as a school we will support children to miss any work they may have missed out. Unfortunately we continue to have families taking their children out of school during term time for holidays and this has a big impact on the children and the other pupils in class.

Please be reminded any unauthorised leave of absence during term time can lead to a fine being issued, this can also include days off from school where no acceptable reason has been provided.

Reading at St Paul's

Changes to how we teach Reading at St Paul's.

EYFS, Key Stage 1 and Year 3

We have recently purchased a new Early Reading Scheme called Little Wandle Letters and Sounds. This is to bring our reading approaches in line with the new guidance about how to teach children to read. Little Wandle Letters and Sounds is a systematic synthetic phonics (SSP) programme. Year 3 will spend the first term consolidating their phonetical awareness which will support them in becoming fluent readers.

There are two types of reading books that your child will bring home:

- A reading practice book Collins Big Cat: This will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently.
- A sharing book: Your child may not be able to read this book on their own, as it is not fully decodable and may not match their exact phonics level. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.

The Reading Practice Book: Big Cat Books

This book has been carefully matched to your child's current reading level. If your child is reading it with little help, please don't worry that it's too easy – your child needs to develop fluency and confidence in reading. Please ensure you listen to them read the book. Remember to give them lots of praise – celebrate their success! If they can't read a word, read it to them. After they have finished, talk about the book together.

This reading book will need to be in school every day, ready for our reading sessions.

We recommend that children read for 5-10 minutes each night. Please can you continue to record this reading session in your child's reading record.

The Sharing Book: Oxford Reading Tree, Songbirds, Bug Club or Library book

In order to encourage your child to become a lifelong reader, it is important that they learn to read for pleasure. The sharing book is a book they have chosen for you to enjoy together. Please remember that you shouldn't expect your child to read this alone. Read it to or with them. Discuss the pictures, enjoy the story, predict what might happen next, use different voices for the characters, and explore the facts in a non-fiction book. The main thing is that you have fun!

In School:

During school, your child will read with an adult. This will be in either a small group or 1:1. An adult will write in your child's reading record with advice on how you could further support your child. Support for Parents:

These three videos (link below) show you how to pronounce the sounds. Notice how the children don't add an 'uh' sound at the end, so they say: 't' not 'tuh'. Use the downloadable information to help your child remember how to write their letters and say their sounds.

The resources on the above link will also help you support your child with saying their sounds and writing their letters. There are also some useful which demonstrate how they are taught phonics and reading at school. You will also receive a home learning sheet which shows you the graphemes your child has been working on with words and sentences that your child could practise reading.

KS2 Reading: In KS2 children will be provided with two books. The first is their Accelerated Reader book, this book is a book that matches your child's reading level. Please do not worry if your child can read their book fluently, as in KS2 children are developing their comprehension skills and understanding of what they have read, not just their fluency. Children then take a quiz after they have finished their book to assess whether they have understood what they have read. The other book children are provided with is a library book, this may be from the school library or their class reading area. This book is selected by your child and is used for whole class reading and to develop a love of reading!
