

Geography - Weather and Climate

We will be learning about the different climate zones (temperate, polar and tropical) across the world and describe the features of these biomes. We will be using maps, atlases and Google Earth to identify the latitude and longitude of different countries and will consider how this affects the climate. We will consider why people choose to live in certain areas before answering the big question of 'Why is climate important?'

Geography Vocabulary

Weather - the way the air and atmosphere feels.

Climate - the pattern of weather over a long period of time.

Biomes - regions of the world with similar climate.

Tropical climate - warm or hot temperatures throughout the year.

Polar climate - temperatures below freezing.

Temperate - a mixture between tropical and polar climates

Latitude - horizontal, imaginary lines running at equal distances above and below the equator.

Longitude - vertical, imaginary lines that run from the north pole to the south pole

Religious Education - What is it like to follow God?

We will learn the story of Noah and understand the idea of covenant. We will understand the importance of promises and use this knowledge to compare promises made in Noah's story to the way we live. We will learn about the Old Testament and how the people of God try to live in a way that is pleasing.

History

Children will learn to ask valid questions about the local area and consider which buildings make Bradford significant. Through analysing sources we will understand why people migrated to Bradford, what they did and how they spent their leisure time. We will be using some of the learning in the Our Bradford unit of study to help us.

History Vocabulary

Significant - when something has an important meaning.

Listed building - a special building with an historic interest.

Architecture - the art and design of a building.

Migration - a long journey to a new home.

Leisure - the time left over after taking care of important things.

Heritage - the traditions, achievements and beliefs that are part of the history of a group of people.

Sources - someone or something that provides information.

God - the creator and ruler of the universe.
