Geography

Over the half term we will find out about the regions of the UK, discovering how some of these areas have changed over time. We will research how specific areas of the UK have been affected by change and the impact this has had on the different locations around the country. Finally, we will conduct our own fieldwork study of our local area looking at how it has changed and the impact this has had on the environment and people who live in Bradford.

<u>History</u>

This half term we will learn about the world of the Anglo-Saxons. We will consider why they came to Britain and consider whether the period deserves to be called the 'Dark Ages'. Throughout the half term we will use a variety of sources to form our opinion, including archaeological evidence and written evidence from that time.

Artefact: an object from the past that shows evidence of what life was like
