In line with our school vision, this gave our pupils the opportunity to flourish by experiencing new challenges and playing a number of traditional instruments from around the world.

### Community

All of our pupils have made Christmas cards and decided where they would like them to be sent. We have now delivered the cards to the local food bank, Salvation Army, Care Home and given them to families, staff and governors. We are proud to share our kind thoughts through this gesture at this special time of year.







## Attendance

We are finishing this half term with an overall school attendance of 91% The class with the best overall attendance was Year 3 followed by Year 5 We have 26 pupils who have maintained 100% attendance so far this school year! We appreciate there was unavoidable absence this half term due to sickness and we thank parents for their understanding and patience whilst we rescheduled events in school to ensure everyone was kept safe.

As a school, we have started additional monitoring of attendance to ensure we are providing the correct support where required to aid pupils to attend school as often as possible.

Unfortunately, we continue to have children taking time off from school for unauthorised leaves of absence. Please be reminded this not only disrupts your child's learning but can also lead to a fine from the local authority being issued.



### Governance

Our young leaders in school have recently met with our retired Chair of Governors, Mr Paul Bland.

We thanked him for his valuable contribution to our school over the last twenty years and presented him with gifts and cards from our pupils and staff.

He has worked with many Governors and five Headteachers over the years and shared some of his experiences with our pupils.

Mr Bland has played a significant part in shaping St Paul's and we value the work he has done tremendously. He will truly be a valued friend of the school for many years to come.

Our Chair of Governors is now Mr Bryan Harrison and we will be finding out more about him next term.



## Staffing

On behalf of the pupils and staff I would like to thank Mrs Davis, Mrs Broadbent and Mrs Raza for their hard work at St Paul's as they move on to different roles in their chosen fields.

Mrs Raza has been supporting St Paul's as Acting Deputy Headteacher, whilst Mrs Timms is on Maternity Leave, and now she is moving on to work in a similar role at Lidget Green. We wish them all every happiness and success in the future.

Mrs Westbury has joined our staff in the office as Finance Assistant and Mrs Wilson will be joining us in January, supporting pupils and teaching in Key Stage 2, in the first instance. Miss Bi, Mrs Malik and Miss Beaumont are also recent valuable additions to our flourishing staff team.



## Bridge Builders

Bridge builders is our innovative approach to school council to enable more pupils to be involved in the decision making in school and to have 'a voice'. Our late Queen, Head of the Church of England, who said that we should 'build bridges to the future', inspired this initiative.

Bridges are the symbol of 'communication' and 'unity' and we have therefore created 'Bridge Builders', who work on developing our school and shaping our future. Through initial class discussions, 2 Bridge Builders are elected who then attend a meeting with a teacher within school. This is an opportunity to hear from each class and to pave the way forward. Children discuss aspects they are proud of and suggest elements they would like to change.

Together, as Bridge Builders, we discuss and agree on the way forward, electing project managers to oversee the initiative across the school. Opportunities for reflection are built into the conversations and once the new ideas are launched and embedded the Bridge Builders meet again to discuss the impact of the changes, considering what has worked well and what could be improved further.

So far this year we have led 2 Bridge Builder initiatives

- 1. Collective Worship
- 2. Positive Relationships in school

Our next project will be linked directly to 'courageous advocacy' and will give our pupils the opportunity to share their ideas about charities/ causes that are important to them locally, nationally and globally. It will also prompt discussions around what actions we can take alongside fundraising.


