Maths

This term we will be verbally counting to 20 as part of our place value unit. During this unit we will also be ordering and comparing numbers up to 20. Children can often find it tricky to count the teen numbers so we will use number tracks to help us with this skill.

We will be learning how to add and subtract numbers to 20 and learning our number bonds to 20. We will look at doubles and near doubles of numbers within 20 using a range of resources to help us.

Once we have understood place value to 20, Class Keighley will move on to understanding place value of numbers up to 50. We will use base ten to help us represent these numbers and we will learn how to count in 10s by making groups of 10. We will then use our new learning to order and compare numbers to 50.

In Year One, we will also learn how to measure length and height and compare objects based on size. We will begin to learn about the unit of measure, centimetres.

We will also be learning about heavier and lighter objects and comparing them by weight. In addition, we will be learning about capacity and will be finding out about how we can measure it.
