Increased school meal costs

Our catering contractors, FM Catering have informed schools that as from Monday 17th April 2023, the price of school meals for pupils will rise to £2.10 (this includes a meal and pudding)





Absence and Lateness

Please can I remind parents to phone school by 8:40am in the morning if your child will be absent. Please leave an answerphone message providing details for the reason of absence and an expected return date.

Also, we have an increasing number of children who are persistently late, arriving just 5 minutes late each day not only has a big impact on your child's learning but also on the learning of others.

Arriving 5 minutes late each day:

- 5 days a week = 25 minutes lost learning time a week.
- 39 weeks a year = 16 hours and 15 minutes lost learning time a year.
- 7 years in our school = 113 hours and 45 minutes learning time lost.

Arriving late to school can:

- Cause embarrassment for your child to walk into class late
- Children miss out on the social time to settle into class
- Arriving late means the teacher often has to stop and repeat the teaching the late arrival has
 missed causing a delay for the other children in class to complete their work
- Creates a bad habit that is hard to break
- Can lead to the poor attendance If your child thinks that it is okay to be late for school they can soon think it's okay not to go to school at all

Unauthorised holidays in term time

Absence due to unauthorised leave taken during term time is a significant issue for all Bradford schools. Children in Bradford are twice as likely to be absent due to unauthorised leave during term time than the average child in England.

Absence due to unauthorised leave during term time covers a variety of reasons for absence, including holidays during term time and travel to other countries to visit family and attend celebrations and events. Currently schools can request a penalty notice from Bradford Council for each child, and each parent, where unauthorised leave takes place. Despite this, absence due to unauthorised leave during term time continues to take place, with a significant number of families taking more than one period of absence during an academic year, or taking a period of leave of four weeks or more.

A decision has been made by Bradford Council to change their approach to situations where families take two or more periods of unauthorised leave in a 12-month period, or when a period of four or more weeks of leave is taken. In these instances, Bradford Council will utilise the option to start legal proceedings via the magistrates' court, instead of issuing a penalty notice. This means that parents may be liable to receive a significantly higher fine (up to £2,500 per child, per parent) if found guilty, as well as receive a criminal record, which may be reportable to employers (for example, via a DBS Check). In rare circumstances, magistrates can consider a custodial sentence for up to 3 months. This change will come into force from 1st April 2023.

Requests for leave during term time are never taken lightly and we will always consider the social, emotional and cultural reasons for the leave, whether the leave is exceptional, as well as your child's overall level of attendance, academic attainment and the impact any leave may have on your child's learning during their time away.

Medicine In School

Please be reminded we can only accept medicine in school if it has been prescribed by a doctor and has a prescription label with name, dosage and date of prescription attached.



We can also accept non prescribed medicine if this is accompanied by a doctors note and has been discussed and agreed with the school SENDCO or Head Teacher.

Parments to school

Please be aware that we will be using a new system after Easter (April). The change will be that if your child is allocated a place in a club, the payment for the six week block will be requested in one payment at the outset of the sessions. This system will make it simpler for parents to keep track of payments and will ensure that places are funded, enabling clubs to continue to run.



Holiday Activities

Children on benefits-related free school meals are eligible for a free place at a HAF holiday club during the Easter, summer and Christmas school holidays.

HAF clubs provide free fun activities and a healthy meal for eligible children, including children with SEND or additional needs.

Places are limited on the clubs so please book early to avoid missing out.
