

St. Paul's C.E. Primary School Year 3 Curriculum Overview 2025-2026






English

This half term we will be exploring the texts 'Stone Age Boy' by Satoshi Kitamura and 'Crazy Hair' by Neil Gaiman.





The children will explore both texts and will have written a narrative and poetry piece of writing by the end of the units using the texts as their inspiration.

The children will focus on elements such as direct speech, fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases to create their pieces of writing.

Maths

Addition & Subtraction

This half term in Maths the children will be exploring adding and subtracting 2-digit and 3-digit numbers with exchanges. To be successful with this; it is essential that children are confident in both using and applying their number binds to and within 10. Once this has been consolidated, children will apply their knowledge of number bonds to 10 to number binds to 100 for example: 3+2=5, so 30+20=50.

Multiplication & Division

Children will write and calculate Mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables that they know. They will learn to multiply and divide 2- digit numbers by 1-digit numbers using mental and formal written methods.

Religious Education

In RE the children will be exploring the key question, 'What are the deeper meanings of festivals?'

The children will explore the main beliefs at the heart of religious festivals. They will make clear links between these beliefs and the stories recalled at the festivals. Furthermore, they will raise questions and suggest answers about what is worth celebrating and remembering in religious communities and in their own lives.









Science

In Science this half term the children will be exploring the topic 'light and shadows. During the topic children will be able to explain the role of light sources, recognise Bronze Age or Iron Age. The children that everyone faces worries and the which materials cast a shadow and summarise how shadows change throughout the day



History / Geography

In History this half term we will be exploring the question, 'would you prefer to have lived in the Stone Age. The children will be able to explain will have the opportunity to use archaeological evidence of each period of time. They will be able to explain how the Bronze Age transformed prehistoric life and the importance of trade during the Iron Age.



PSHE

In PSHE this half term we will be exploring the book 'Ruby's worry'. importance of asking for help when these worries become overwhelming. The children will describe some physical signs of worry and explore some simple self-care techniques to use when they may feel worried.



Music

In Music this half term the children will create compositions for an animation. They will use samba and carnival sounds to tell a story from a piece of music through movement.



Art / DT

In DT this half term the children will explore the topic: Cooking and nutrition: eating seasonally. The children will be able to explain whu food comes from different places around the world and to explain the benefits of seasonal foods. The children will evaluate seasonal ingredients and finally evaluate a dish.



This half term in PE the children will explore 'Dodgeball' and 'Gymnastics' and the skillset involved in each. Dodgeball- Key skills
