English	Maths	Religious Education
<p>In English, we will continue to develop our sentence writing and build on this by beginning to write sequences of sentences.</p> <p>We will be using a variety of texts to help us on our writing journey. Over the half term we will learn about question marks and exclamation marks and how they are used instead of full stops.</p> <p>Some of the books we will look at are;</p> <div data-bbox="264 842 667 1200"></div> <p>Our author of the half term is</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Eric Carle</p>	<p>This half term, we will continue our work with numbers to 50, exploring how they are made and building confidence in reading, writing, and representing them.</p> <p>We will keep developing our addition and subtraction skills, both through mental maths strategies and by using number lines. As part of our addition work, we will also be learning to double numbers within 20 and practising how to add tens and ones separately. Please feel free to test us at home to see how quickly we can recall these facts!</p> <p>We will carry on counting in 2s, 5s, and 10s, gradually extending the numbers we count to as we become more confident.</p> <p>In our measurement work, we will continue practising our skills and begin using rulers and metre sticks independently.</p> <p>We will also start learning to tell the time. Miss Briggs will work with us every day, beginning with reading times to the hour ('o'clock').</p>	<p>In RE we will be answering the question,</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Why does Easter matter to Christians?</p> <p>During this unit we will be looking at springtime and new life. This will be linked to the Easter Story and both the great sadness and happiness this brings for Christians, Children will have the opportunity to recreate the Easter Garden. We will also take the opportunity to look at foods we eat over Easter and the link between these and gospels from the Bible.</p> <div data-bbox="1464 858 2110 906" style="background-color: #f4a460; padding: 5px;">Reminders</div> <p>Reading records need to be in school every day! We change reading books on a Wednesday and Library books on a Monday.</p> <p>PE is on Monday and Tuesday – children need to come to school in their PE kit.</p> <p>On Friday, children will receive a homework task this will often be practical and shared on class dojo or on a sheet in your child's reading file.</p>

<p>We will start the half term by finishing off our plants unit. We will be learning more about trees in our area and the different type.</p> <p>We will then move on to look at the weather in further detail, including the seasons and what each one may bring.</p> <p>What signs of spring can you spot?</p> 	<p>What is the weather like in the UK?</p> <p>In Geograophy we will learn to identify and locate the four UK countries, recognise our own country and describe locations using basic compass directions.</p> <p>We will also measure different types of weather, using symbols used in weather forecasts, describe seasonal changes and suggest appropriate clothing and activities for each season.</p>	<p>In Phonics, we have recently moved onto our phase 5 phonemes. We will be learning 4 new sounds a week which will be shared in your child's reading file on a Friday, it includes sounds, words and a sentence to read.</p> <p>Each child will continue to read three times per week with an adult in school, and reading books will be changed every Wednesday.</p> <p>✦ Snuggle Up Stories Bag ✦</p> <p>Every time your child reads at home and has their reading record signed; they'll earn a chance to take home the Snuggle Up Stories bag. The more they read, the more chances they have!</p>	<p>This half term, Mr Murrell will continue to coach us in PE once a week. We will be focusing on orienteering, we will be focusing on following instructions, following directions and using these skills to solve problems.</p>  <p>With Miss Briggs we will be working on our gymnastics skills. We will be looking at travelling, jumping and rolling but this half term we will be doing this using our exciting gymnastics equipment.</p>
